

STOP the spread of Wild Parsnip



1st year: rosette of leaves,
6 inches high



Leaves with 5-15 leaflets
up to 18 inches long



Grooved stem with
clasping leaves



4 - 6 feet tall
Blooms late May - July



Yellow flower clusters
2 - 8 inches wide



Seed flattened, oval,
1/4 inch long



Seeds in the fall



Grows along road ways
and open sites

CAUTION! Plant sap can cause severe blistering and swelling.

AVOID MOWING after seed set as the seed will be spread from the infested site into new areas.
