Native Prairie Seed Mixes include grasses and wildflowers that are more resistant to drought, flood and pests; attract more wildlife; involve less maintenance; and provide beautiful displays of flowers, foliage and fall color. All of our prairie mixes include a package of oats to be used as a cover crop. If mowed before going to seed each of the first three years, they will disappear from your planting as the native plants take hold. Each seed mix is sufficient to cover 545 square feet. We recommend establishing the grasses before planting wildflowers. Site preparation is important so visit our website at http://www.Anokaswcd.org. Dry Mixed Height Prairie Seed - This seed mix is perfect for dry sandy locations. Once it's established, it never needs water. Tree Aids

Moisture Retention Root Gel - Provided as a powder, when mixed with water this super absorbent material forms a gel. Dip the seedling roots before planting to ensure that water in the root zone is held in place to be released on demand. This helps to reduce the planting shock and is very beneficial in our dry, well-drained sandy soils. One bag treats 50 seedlings.
